

Goals

- Preserve 49 acres Open Space adjacent to State Wildlife Management Area
- Protect stream corridors for water quality & woodlands for Open Space & trails
 - Preserve 60 acres of farmland with historic farmhouse & barns
 - Preserve a working farm and beautiful view-sheds
 - Retention of Preserved Farm on Readington Twp tax rolls

Readington Twp. Open Space Advisory Board - 2019

Where does the money come from?

49 acres public Open Space will be paid 100% by County and State:

- \$400k in Hunterdon County Grants will pay 50% of acquisition costs and have been approved for the Open Space (OS) Trust Fund by county Freeholders
- NJ-Green Acres matching funds for Open Space of \$400k

Preservation of the 60 acre farm will be attained by 100% reimbursement from County / State / Township auction of the property

- Farmland Preservation with Easement Purchase
 - 43%
 - County & State Contribution (\$350k in process) 28% County Trust, Municipal Grants Fund (\$200k expected) 15%
 - Auction of 60 acre preserved farm, house, & barns (\$750k expected) 57%

Total funds estimated to be reimbursed by County/State/Twp auction



Preservation highlights:

- Protection of open space near the South Branch of the Raritan River
 - Preservation of agricultural area around Three Bridges

Additional benefits of preserving Saums Farm:

- Preservation of Readington's rural character
- Buffer protection for State Wildlife Management Area (South Branch of the Raritan)
- Retention of Preserved Farm on Tax rolls
- Public access to trails and open space
- Protection of water quality and reduction of storm water

Summary

 Open Space and Farmland preservation, enhancing the area's agriculture, providing recreational opportunities, protecting water quality and preserving high quality wildlife habitat and forested land.

Preservation Funding Sources (Bond with 2.1 M reimbursement over 2 years)

- Hunterdon County Grants (400k / OS applications)
- NJ State Green Acres (400k 50 % match for Open Space)
- Farmland Preservation (approx. 350k for development rights)
- Township Farm Auction (estimate 750k sales price)
- County Trust Municipal Grants Fund (200k)

- As of Dec 2 2019:
 - County Freeholders approved two OS funding applications
 - Nov 2018 \$161,000 application approved
 - July 2019 \$242,000 application approved
 - County Agriculture Development Board
 - Nov 15 2019 Preliminary approval
