- a. Preservation activities:

- b. County Open Space: Dr. Kelly reported that the committee had a reorganization and William Millette will be responsible for administering preservation projects and applications. The county is pursuing a grant application for flood control on Pleasant Run.
- 8. Mrs. Duffy informed the Board that the latest open space map is now available and that the Township passed the resolution to support the "Learning Woods" grant.
- 9. The Board by voice vote requested that DPW enclose the Cole Road north trail head in a way to prevent vehicular entrance. In addition, no motorized vehicle signs should be posted at the Cole Road site and both entrances to the Pleasant Run Greenway (off Pleasant Run and Summer Road).

10. Old Business:

- a. Current Projects:
- i. Dr.Kelly said that the students had started tapping the Norway maples at Forest Hill Preserve.
- ii. Mr. Klotz provided a report on scout projects completed in 2014 and in process.
- b. Forest Hill Preserve Grant. Mr. Becker reported that the application has been submitted to Sustainable New Jersey. Grant funds would support a woodlands inventory, benchs, kiosks and deer exclosure area.
- c. Mrs. Sabin reported that the Raritan Greenway group requested a meeting. The Board concurred that the current subcommittee should participate. A map of the proposed greenway plan was provided.
- d. Mr. Huelsebusch affirmed that the RVCC study results on forest health will be presented at the April meeting. The report will be held in the court room with an invitation to other interested parties.

11. New Business:

- a. Mr. Heller brought to the Board's attention initiatives taken by Raritan Headwaters Association for their river clean-up. Readington sites include Rockafellows and Three Bridges bridge. More information can be obtained from the RHA website.
- b. Mr. Klotz reminded members that we should begin to prepare for the Memorial Day table.
- c. Mr. Klotz suggested that OSAB develop a public forum where questions could be discussed. Mr. Klotz, Mrs. Allen and Mr. Huelsebusch will review options.
- d. Mrs. Allen proposed that OSAB support a farm tour sometime in late April early May. The Board requested Mrs. Allen plan the event.
- e. The Board supported the need to continue the nursery. A planting plan is needed indicating what tree species are needed and where they should be planted. Members should submit their suggestions to Mr. Huelsebusch for further discussion.
- f. Mr. Becker made a presentation of the OneNote document management system. Mr. John, Mr. Klotz, Mr. Heller and Mrs. Sabin voluteered to participate in reviewing the application.
